

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## Mounting your sensor

1. Unsnap the back plate from the sensor housing.



Using the backplate as a guide, mark and drill pilot holes where you want to install the sensor.

- 2. Use the two #6 screws included to install the backplate.
- 3. Snap the sensor onto the backplate.
- 4. Optional: If extra strain relief is needed, you may insert a #4 screw and washer into the strain relief portion of the sensor cable and secure to the surface.




5. Plug the RJ connector into the jack labeled "Temp/Hum" on a Sensor Transmitter (product numbers 6331 or 6332). (See the Sensor Transmitter User Guide.)

#### Maintaining your sensor

To keep your Temperature/Humidity Sensor most accurate, you should inspect it periodically for dust, debris, and insect nests or webs. Clean the sensor screen with a soft brush.
